

Zoltan Hosszu – bio (July 2024)

Zoltan Hosszu is a seasoned leader in the intersection of sustainability, education, and spiritual development. Born in 1977 in Pécs, Hungary, he pursued an initial education in software engineering and robotics. Embracing a spiritual path early, Zoltan Hosszu joined the International Society for Krishna Consciousness (ISKCON) in 1994 and has since played a significant role in various capacities within the organization.

After moving to Krishna Valley Eco Village in 2005, Zoltan Hosszu expanded his academic pursuit by earning a degree in Agro-Economy and Rural Development Engineering. His studies concentrated on sustainable agricultural practices and the development of rural communities, aligning with his growing responsibilities within Krishna Valley and beyond.

Zoltan Hosszu currently serves as the Governing Body Commission (GBC) secretary for Hungary, Romania, Turkey, and Cyprus, and as the co-GBC for Greece. In these roles, he oversees the integration of spiritual education with sustainable development initiatives.

In Krishna Valley, Zoltan Hosszu has directed several key areas including Tourism, Communications/PR, and Event Management. His leadership helped transform the valley into a renowned destination for educational tourism focused on sustainability. Additionally, he has chaired the Eco Valley Foundation since 2010, spearheading scientific cooperation with universities and affiliations such as the Hungarian Academy of Sciences and maintaining observer status at the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC).

His commitment to sustainability extends into the broader community through his service as Deputy Mayor of the local government, where he integrated sustainable practices into local governance from 2010 to 2014. Furthermore, Zoltan Hosszu was an executive board member of the Global Village Initiative Committee and was an Executive Council member of the Global Ecovillage Network, Europe (GEN-Europe), overseeing cooperation among Europe's eco-villages and change management in the international organization.

Beyond his organizational roles, Zoltan Hosszu founded a leadership consulting and training company in 2016, focusing on imparting leadership skills grounded in sustainable and ethical principles.

Zoltan Hosszu is also deeply involved in a range of personal interests that complement his professional work. He is an avid practitioner of traditional Hungarian horseback archery, engages in carpentry focusing on sustainable building practices, and enjoys cooking, particularly emphasizing traditional Indian cuisine.

His linguistic capabilities include native proficiency in Hungarian and fluency in English, facilitating his engagement in international forums and collaborations.
